

1. <u>no25 | Behind the revolt</u> (24 minutes; 2008; editor, director, writer)

The docu analyzes and highlights the chronology of the events that has led Malaysian Indians to the street protesting on the Nov 25, 2007. Despite repeated warnings and a court order which allowed the police to 'arrest on sight', they came out in the thousands on Nov 25 into the streets of Kuala Lumpur.

2. Revisiting Malaysia '1988' Judiciary Crisis (9 minutes, 2008, director/editor) https://vimeo.com/1555720

Two decades have passed since the 1988 judiciary crisis. But the effects still linger. The phrase 'judiciary crisis of 1988' is generally understood as relating to the suspension and sacking of Supreme Court judges including the then Lord President Salleh Abas.

3. Bersih Rally 2007: A cry for royal help (13-minutes; 2008; editor, director, writer)

The Coalition for Clean and Fair Elections (Bersih) wants an election system that is free and fair. Bersih organised a massive rally in Kuala Lumpur on Nov 10. Despite a police cordon and use of water cannon and tear gas, some 40,000 protesters managed to march to Istana Negara (Royal Palace) where a petition was handed to the King's representative.



4. The forgotten Malaysians (9 minutes; 2008; editor, director)

A story of the Orang Asli from Royal Belum, Hulu Perak. This video was a 'Merdeka' project. And among many that I produced for Malaysiakini in the year of 2007, this video remain the best in terms of its production quality and in the overall presentation.

5. <u>Kg Buah Pala- pawn in a political game</u> (7 minutes; 2009; editor, director, writer)

The plight of the villagers in Kampung Buah Pala or as 'Tamil High Chaparral' as it popularly known

to Penangites hit the headlines recently after they received a court order to vacate their old settlement

of which three generations have lived to make way for a modern condominium.

6. <u>Love ... in despair</u> (5 minutes; 2009; editor, director, writer)

Forced by poverty and disability, a woman contemplated suicide. She wanted to take her 13 children with her. Just when Parameswari had come to the conclusion that death was the only remedy, fate had a pleasant surprise in store.



7. <u>'They stole 11 months from me'</u> (17 minutes; 2008; editor, director, writer)

This is the story of vulnerable young single mother who shares her tragic story of how 11 months were stolen from her life ... Rajeswary, a Malaysian woman locked up 11 months mistakenly by her own government, the single mother was six months pregnant when she was accused of being an 'illegal' Sri Lankan immigrant.










8. Deleted from victors' history: The other freedom fighters (10 minutes; 2008; editor, director)

A story about members of the 10th

Regiment of the Communist Party of Malaya led by Abdullah CD and their role in gaining independence for the country that remains unrecognised. They have been based deep in a thick jungle at the border of Malaya and Thailand area, since the end of 1953 following a continuous onslaught against them by the British forces.



The Penans, an indigenous group of people

who lives in Ulu Baram Sarawak, Malaysia are waging a battle on two fronts simultaneously. On one hand, they are trying to protect their jungle from being destroyed by loggers while on the other they are trying their best to get the authorities to provide them with the most basic necessities in life.



10. <u>SPECIAL REPORT</u>: Escape from slavery (4-part series, 2006, director/editor)

On an evening in August 2005, while some 200 estate workers were gathering for a Hindu festival at the small temple, one man had only one thing on his mind - escape. It was the best opportunity for P Ramudu and his heavily pregnant wife A Kalaivany to make a dash for freedom, to escape the clutches of their 'owner' who has 'forced' them to work on the plantation.



The tale of three women's struggle for justice and equality. About Guppy Union that was started by women workers who worked in a plastics factory in Balakong, Cheras. Their struggle and desire to start a union started 14 years ago, when they were frustrated with their bosses for increasing their wages by a mere 10 sen.

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Indrani Kopal is a Film Lecturer in the School of Communication at Taylor's University, Subang Jaya, Malaysia. Her primary research interests focus on documentary filmmaking and in particular the use of first-person narrative to empower the story protagonist. Other research interests include biographical films as cultural memory and national identity. She is an Internationally recognized award-winning filmmaker and a Fulbright Scholar. Her documentary "The Game Changer" was screened at 17 international festivals and won multiple awards. She recently premiered her personal feature documentary film - "Incarcerated Rhythm" in Harlem, New York and currently in post-production of "Phos Graphis: Ismail Hashim", a feature length documentary that explores the sensibility, temperament and aesthetics of the acclaimed Malaysian photographer Ismail Hashim.

PERSONAL STATEMENT

"I have always been curious about the lives of others. Interviewing people and hearing extraordinary stories for the six years working at Malaysiakini from 2006-2012 fueled my interest in people around me. From "Illegal" temple demolitions that created an uproar among Tamils in Malaysia, to the investigative documentary that shook Malaysia as it focused on a slavery case in Bahau, Negeri Sembilan, to a family that escaped after being bonded laborers for three generations, these stories convinced me of the importance of everyday lives. Being able to tell stories of workers rights, the plight of the urban poor, land evictions, poverty, stateless citizens, death-in-custody, gender and sexuality, these are all ongoing themes that have become a part of me as a filmmaker, stories that have influenced me profoundly. Giving a voice to the 'voiceless' has become a mission as I continue to grow as a filmmaker."
